Working in Australia

Working while you study in Australia can help complement your study and living experience. You might want to take part time work while studying to assist with living expenses and gain work experience.

Most student visas allow you to work for up to 40 hours every two weeks while your course is in session, and unrestricted hours during any scheduled course break.

However, before you undertake any paid work you need to make sure your visa allows you to work. First, priority is your study timetable and working is secondary. Ensure you are not working when you should be at College.

If you have qualifications and/or professional work experience, you may be able to find casual or part time work in your field. Australia has a wide range of industries that provide part time employment opportunities.
